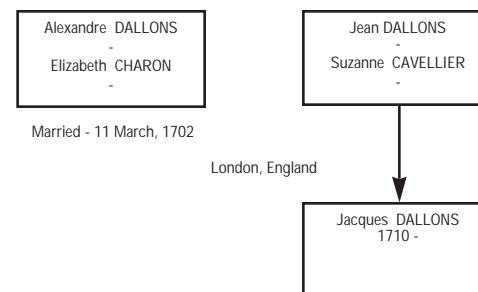

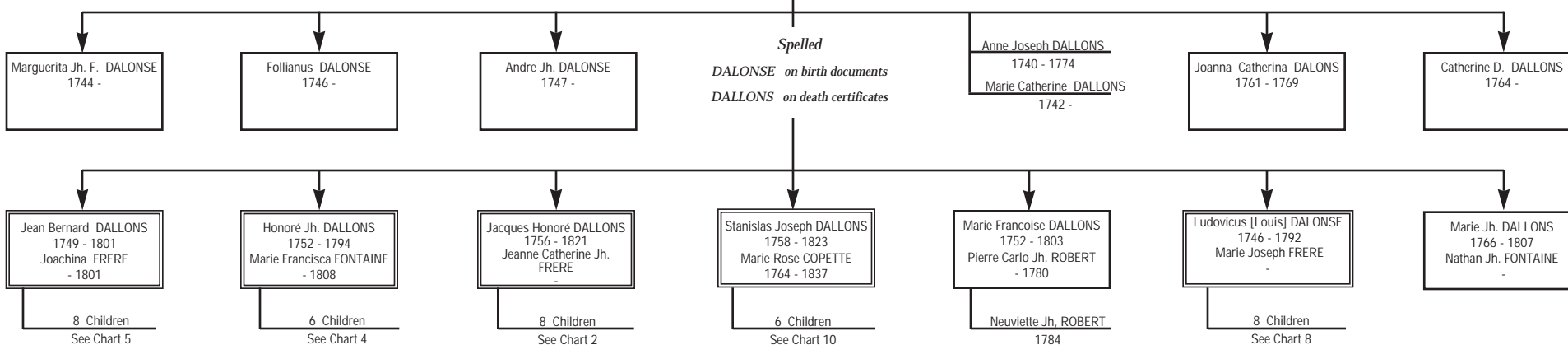
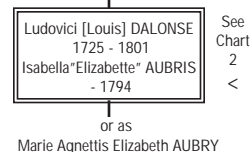
Early 1700 church records from were written in Latin. To confirm identities, written signatures, dates, names of spouses, birth, death & marriage documents were compared to verify the names found. The spelling of the name Dallons (Dalons, Dalonse) is used here as was found on the original documents. Other direct in line family names include: Copette, Bastin, Canva, Pierard, Rollason, Chambers, Dehout, Slipka, Magette and Meurisse.

Most of the research is from Belgian records, however the very first record of a Dallons was found in the English micro-film section of the Family History Library in Salt Lake City. Willis Dallons, looking for his wife's Rollason side of the family and not having any luck, typed the name Dallons and there appeared a page dated 1702 Listed on it was the marriage of Alexander Dallons and Elizabeth Charon at Saint Mary Magdalene Church on Old Fish Street in London. Later I was to find the birth in London of a Jacques Dallons, son of Jean Dallons and Suzanne Cavelier from a French Walloon Church on Threadneedle Street in 1710.

We are still hoping to connect the DALLONS found in London, England to the DALLONS' family tree of Charleroi, Belgium.



Further research is needed to confirm the birth date of the Ludovici DALLONS that is charted below and which will give us his parents names.



Victor Dallons (son) was to give us the important first computer sources from Belgium. From them we were able to continue searching in the local Tehachapi Family History Center. Our challenge has been to tie the families in America to the Dallons in Belgium (1600-1880) and eventually back to the marriage in England of Alexander Dallons in 1702. Belgium records are not yet available from 1880 to the present and records earlier than 1702 from Belgium are scarce. See Addendum
